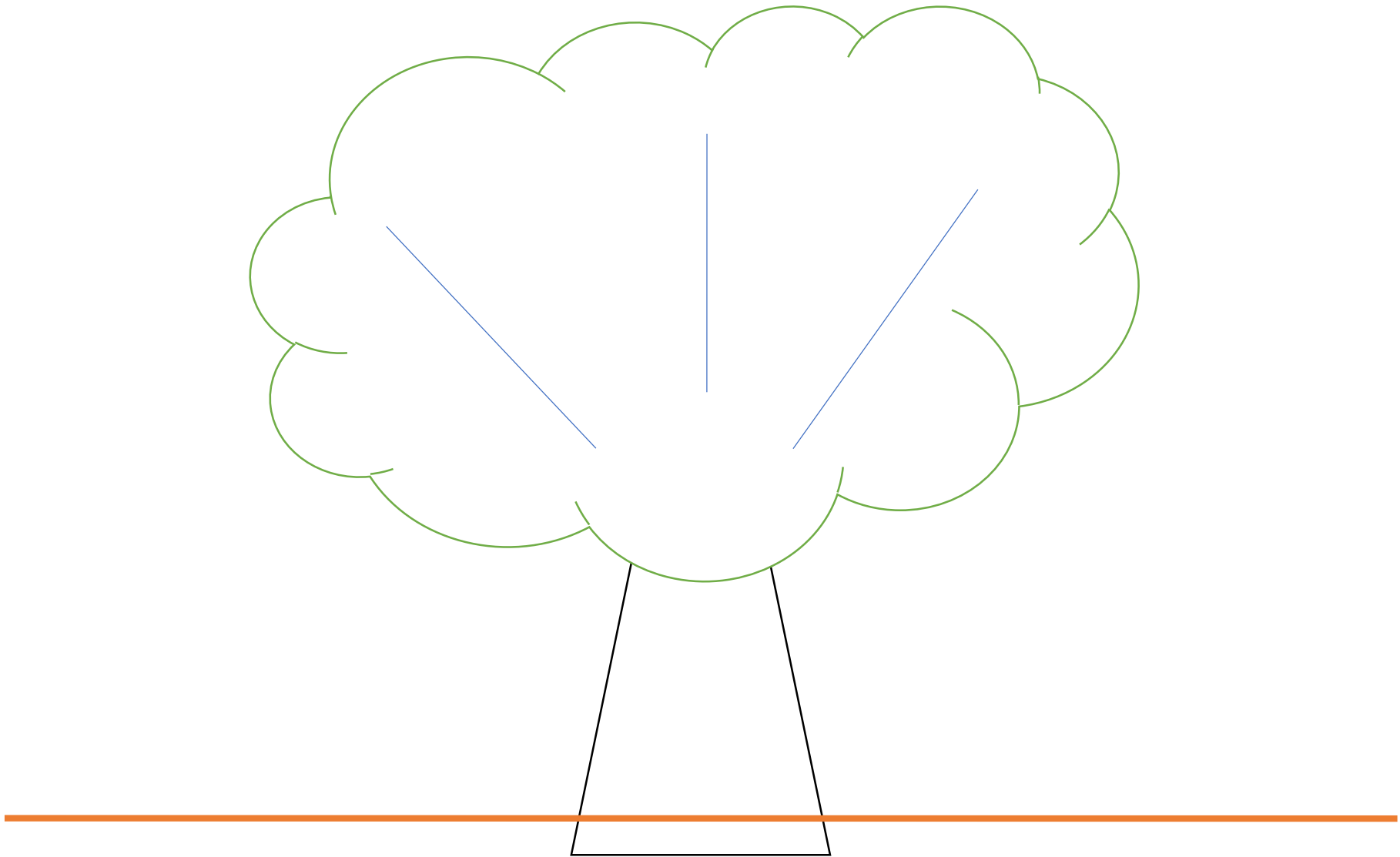

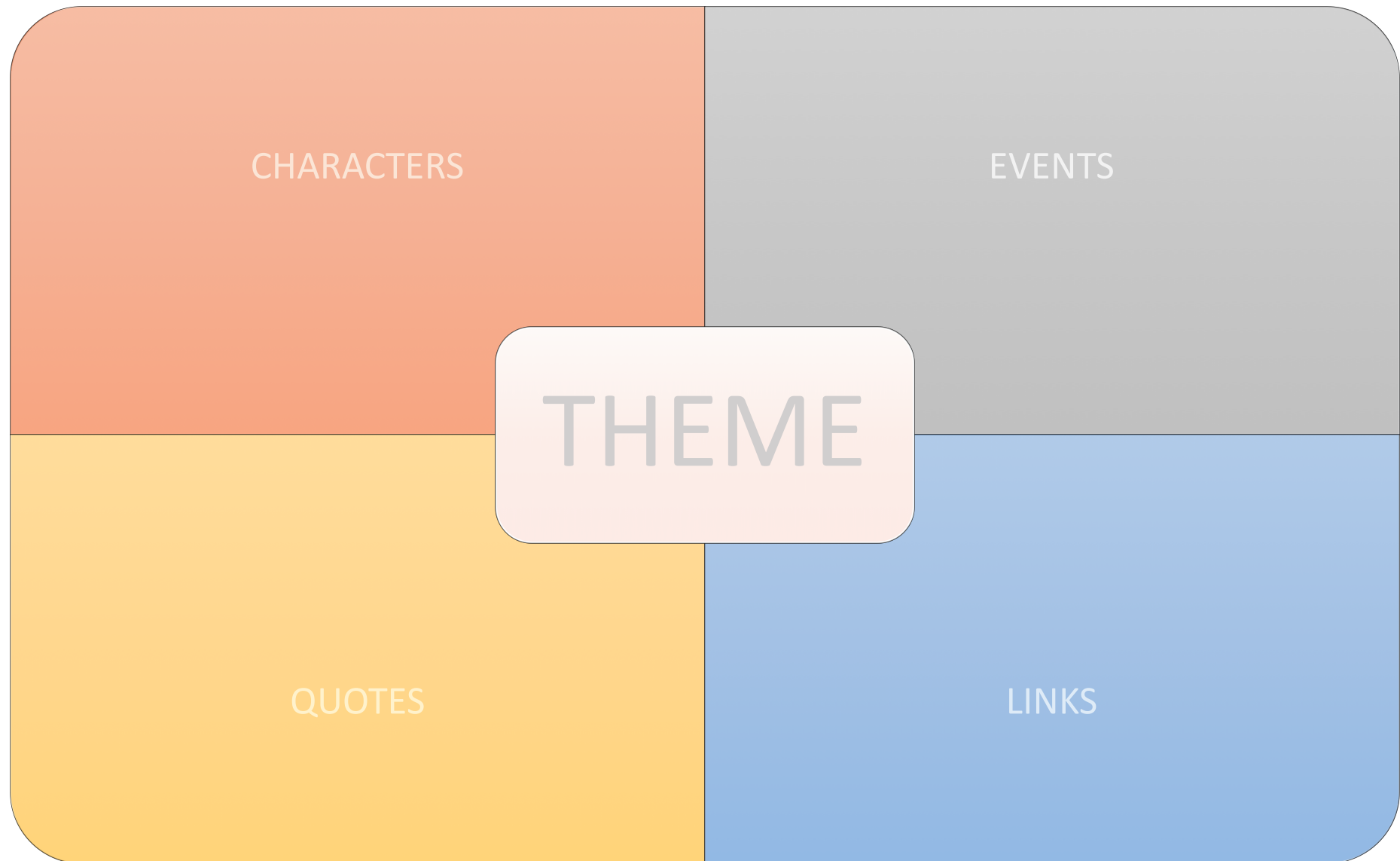
CHARACTER ARC – Fill in the boxes identifying 1. The key event; 2. A related quote; 3. How the character appears at this point

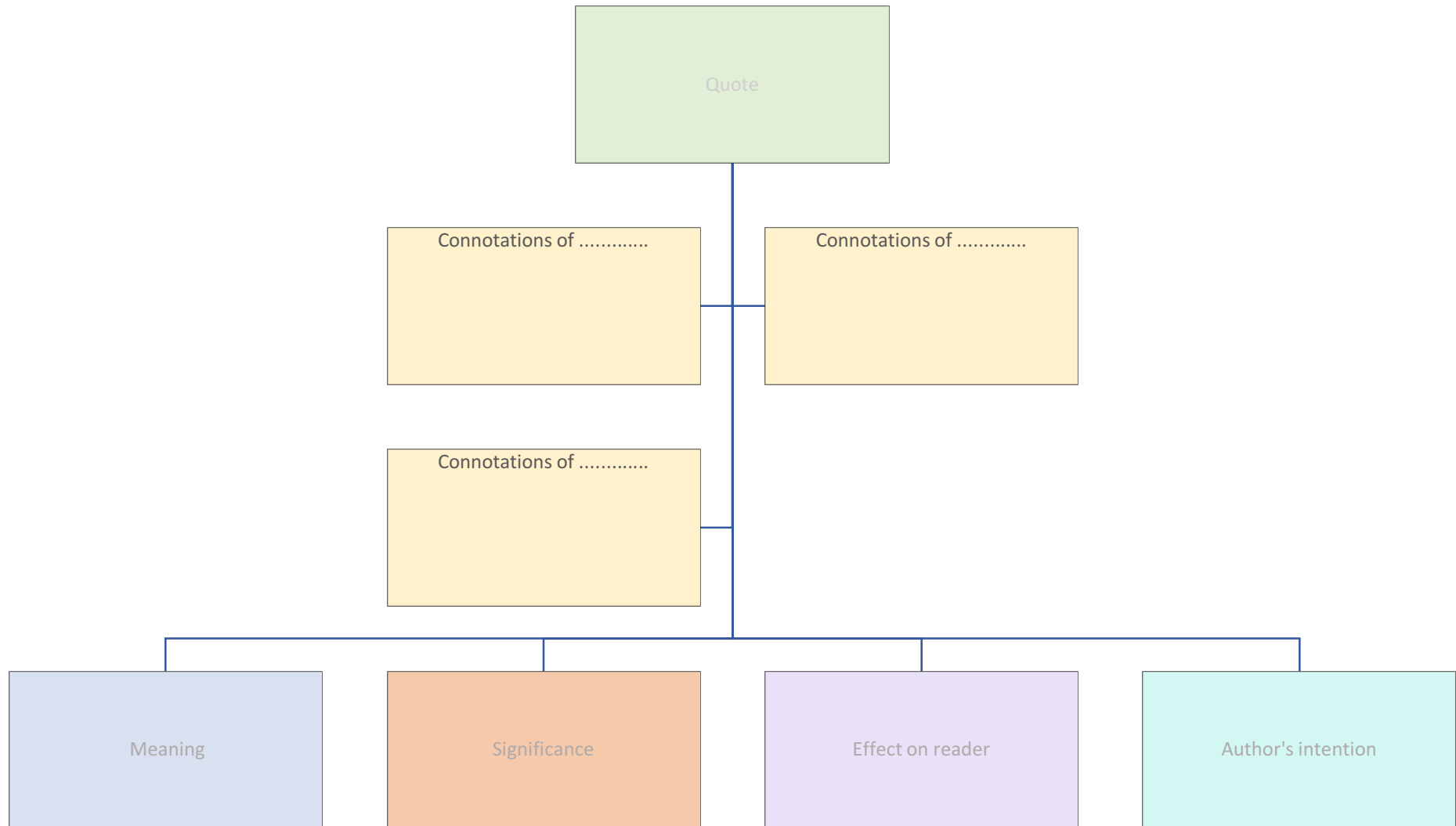

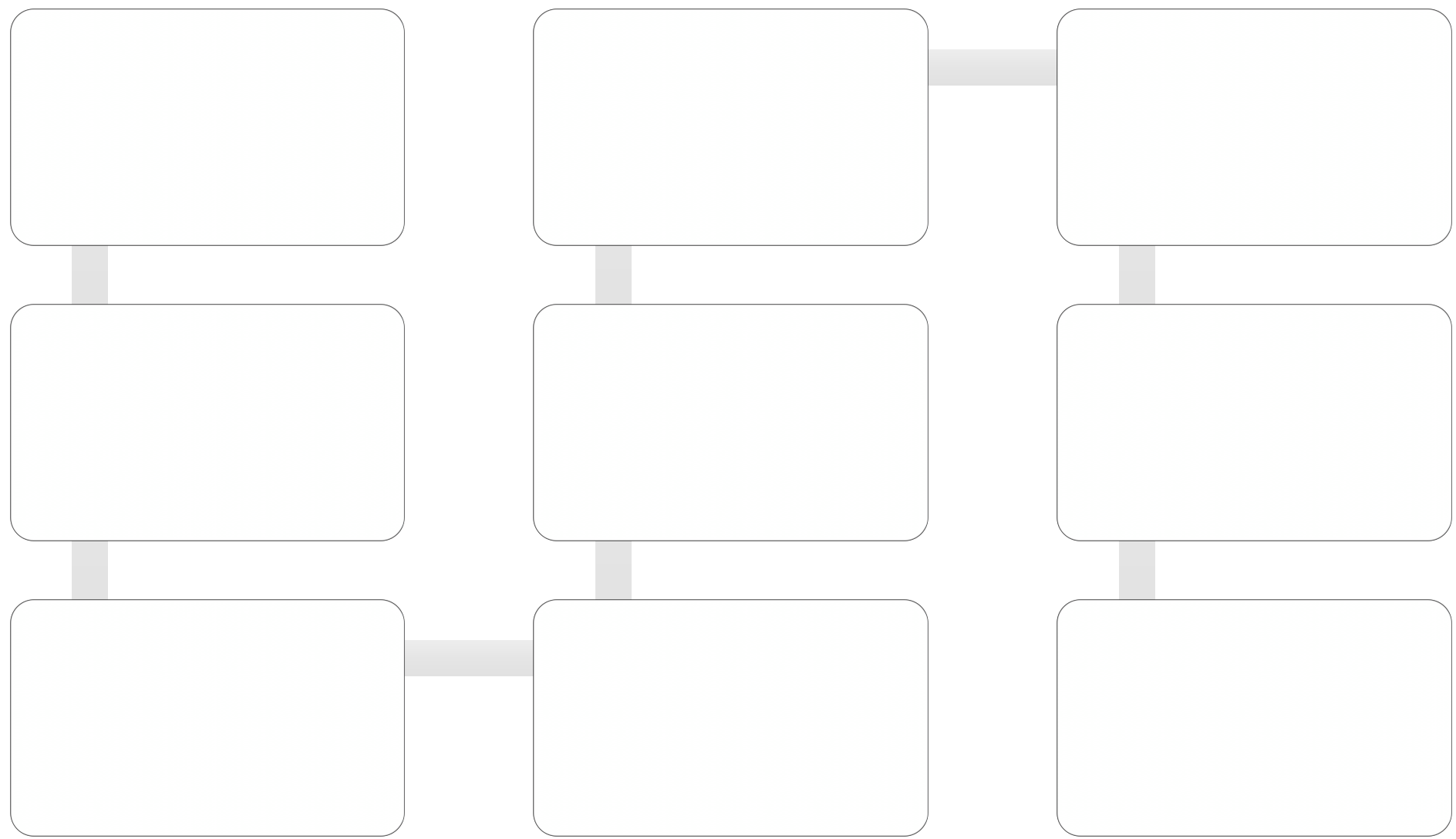
